Frequently Asked Questions -Parents/Carers

What if I want to reach my child during the school day?	We want our students to be engaged in their learning.
	If you need to contact your child during the school day, contact the school office on 02 4261 4011 and the information will be passed on.
What if there is a school emergency?	In case of a school emergency, we direct our students to safety first, following our school emergency response protocol.
Will my student's mobile phone be safe?	Bringing a phone to school has always been the responsibility of the student.
	Confiscated phone's will be placed in an envelope and stored in the Administration area in a secured room.
	Phones are to be left in bags from "Gate to Gate".
	Students will be responsible for the safety of their bags.
	Ideally the phone should remain at home where possible.
If a student uses their mobile phone during school time or takes the phone/device out of their bag?	Students that use their mobile during the day are in breach of the policy.
	They will be immediately directed to place their phone in a KHS phone envelope and complete a Mobile Phone Breach form.
	The staff member will record the breach on SENTRAL-mobile phone breach.
	They will be directed to take the phone envelope to the DP in 500 block.
	DP records on Daily Phone Breach Register and places in Administration secured room.

	Student will then return to class with DP note. They will collect the Phone at 2:30pm from the Administration 500 block or Deputy Principal. If they repeat this behaviour, you, the parent will need to collect the phone and the student may be issued with a formal caution to suspend or be suspended.
What if my child has a medical condition that requires access to a mobile phone during the day?	Arrangements can be made to support students with ongoing medical conditions. Please speak to the appropriate Deputy Principal regarding the applications and requirements.
What if my child has part time employment and needs to organise shifts during the day?	In the first instance students should inform their employers that they will not have access to the phone during school hours.
	However, should this be an issue they can report to the office and arrangements can be made to assist.
