Why Should I?

Over the coming weeks I am sure this will be the question some parents may ask themselves in response to the school's request for parents to pay monies outstanding for the general school fees and elective subject fees.

I am asking parents to understand that there has never been a more pressing time for these payments to be made to their local schools.

Just as household economies are being significantly eroded by ever increasing fees for the basic utilities of water, gas and electricity, so are schools like Kanahooka High School, having to allocate disproportionate amounts of their budgets to these utilities. In doing so, less monies are available to schools to spend on resources, equipment and programs vital for the education of children in the 21st Century.

Whilst being proud of the resources we already have in the school, we appreciate that there is more that needs to be done to provide our students with the very best educational opportunities so that they can compete on an even playing field with students from non-government schools.

To keep pace with the latest advances in technology and teaching practices, we must continue to install state of the art interactive whiteboards in classrooms. Obsolete computers and software must be regularly replaced. Sets of costly textbooks must be purchased to enable students to undertake their Higher School Certificate studies and sporting equipment replaced to encourage and assist students to maintain healthy, active lifestyles.

For this to happen, however, we must ask our parent body to support our school through the payment of fees. With the annual school fees for Year 7 and 8 students being \$40.00, this equates to parents having to pay approximately \$1.00 for every school week in the year. A modest fee for something as important as education.

There is also a fee for Technology of \$30 and Visual Arts of \$20 in Years 7 and 8. This fee covers necessary supplies and equipment to enable your child to experience a taste of these subjects.

To assist in the process of collecting unpaid fees, students in Years 7 to 10 will be issued forms on this coming Monday, which itemise fees outstanding and materials borrowed by students that need to be returned prior to the conclusion of school on Friday 16 December.

You are requested to assist your child to complete this form by paying any outstanding fees and by ensuring they return any textbooks or items belonging to the school.


Getting Down and Dirty


Black dress pants and black dress shorts are available from Lowes, Big W, Kmart, Supre etc for approximately \$15.00-\$35.00
