White Card (General OHS Construction Induction)

For working in the Construction Industry:
We can now offer this to students at a reduced rate of \$68 through Skills West.

Course overview:

This WorkCover NSW course (CPCCOHS1001A) provides participants with a basic understanding of WHS legislation, and the fundamentals of managing risk, to ultimately prevent illness and injury in the construction industry. A White Card is required by any person required to access operating construction areas.

Course Pre-requisites:

You must be over 14 years of age. You must provide 100 points of ID and complete the Evidence of Identity (EOI) form prior to commencing the course. You must also bring your evidence on the day of training. At least one form of identification MUST BE photo type, such as drivers licence, proof of age card or current passport AND proof of current NSW address.

Courses require a minimum 14 days booking due to WorkCover NSW notification requirements.
