



Some other important issues include:

1. Strong Program Art Exhibition – Some students from Years 8, 9 and 10 have been working with outside presenters on what we call the Strong Program on Wednesdays throughout the year. As part of this program they have created photographs and other art works to help them communicate the issues they have dealt with in this program. On Wednesday 30 November from 3 till 4.30pm they will be presenting an exhibition of their work upstairs in the Library. The exhibition is entitled:

Changing The Way We See the World Beyond Expectation, Perception and Inspiration

The students have produced some outstanding work and have been given invitations to hand out to both family and friends. I look forward to being able to publish examples of their work in a future newsletter.

2. 2017 Ski Trip – Next year we are again offering students in Years 9, 10 and 11 2017 the opportunity of attending a snow skiing/boarding excursion. 2017 will be the 17th year in a row that Kanahooka High School have travelled to the NSW Ski Fields. If the enjoyment gained by the students who have participated in previous years is any guide, our 2017 Ski Trip will again be a great success.

We have changed the Ski Trip organisation by commencing it at the end of 2016. This has been done to give parents more time to pay, as it does cost a significant amount of money. We have also implemented the change due to a modification in administration procedures by the Department of Education. These changes mean the money for significant excursions from the end of Term 2 in 2017 will need to be collected earlier.

- Return the slip on the information note to the box outside Mr Kipp's office by Friday November 25.
- Pay a \$50 deposit to the Front Office by Friday November 25. (If you are unable to pay by this date please send a note to school explaining when you are able to pay this deposit).




