Jena took us on a guided tour of the archaeological site that was unearthed in the early 1990s. During our guided tour, a few students were involved in role playing the life of convict George Cribb. Once we finished at The Big Dig, we headed down into The Rocks exploring the alley ways, the old townhouses including Susanna's Place ... which unfortunately we couldn't access as it was closed. The most exciting time we had was when we got our kebabs and gelatos on our way back to the station; where the ride home consisted of mostly snoring with a little bit of laughter."





We walked through the reptile house, went on safari in Africa, took a trip around Outback Australia and got to pat some farm animals as well as getting up close and personal with the lemurs.



PROMOTING A POSITIVE CLIMATE - VIVO

Kanahooka High School is pleased to announce the introduction of VIVO! This is an online rewards system where teachers will award students "points" for positive behaviours across a range of categories (Teamwork, Participation, Leadership, Initiative, Trust, Enthusiasm and Achievement).



Parents/Carers will have access to login to the VIVO System from home to monitor and support the progress of their child.

Our system encourages students to become active members of the school community, take greater responsibility for their own learning and to do their best. Our staff hold high academic and social expectation relationships of their students.

Staff will give points to students as they see appropriate, in class, playground, sport or any other extra curricula opportunity.

Learning for Life Scholarship

Southern Illawarra: Dapto & Shellharbour

Attention Year 7 & 8 families who require financial support for educational needs.

What is the Learning for Life scholarship?

Learning for Life provides families with opportunities to increase their children's success at school, TAFE and University. Learning for Life helps each child reach their potential by supporting their education from primary through to post-school studies.

The Scholarship is granted to a student to help support the financial obligations of an education. Two payments a year can assist with purchasing school uniforms, shoes, textbooks, course materials and paying for excursions.

Who is eligible?

To be eligible for the Learning for Life scholarship you must meet the following criteria:

- Possess a valid Health Care Card or Pension Concession Card.
- Demonstrate a commitment to education i.e. students must have and keep a 90% attendance rate.
- Children attend <u>Kindy to year 8</u> and have been referred to us by a partner school. Our partner high schools include Dapto Kanahooka, Lake Illawarra and Warilla. Primary schools include Mt Brown, Koonawarra, Lakelands, Barrack Heights, Mt Warrigal, Warilla North, and Warilla.

What we ask of families:

To continue to receive scholarship payments over the course of their child's education, families must:

- Show a commitment to their child's education by ensuring their children attend school regularly.
- Complete a short student profile for their sponsor each year.
- Provide a copy of end of year school reports.
- Keep receipts of educational expenses and be able to show these if requested.
- Participate in regular contact and work with their Family Partnership Coordinator.

How do I apply for the Learning for Life scholarship?

If you feel that you know of a family who could benefit from this program, please send a completed referral form to Alisha McLuckie. One family can have up to 4 children on the scholarship. They must all meet the required criteria.

Dear Parent or Guardian and staff,

13/09/2016

A child from the Kanahooka High School has been diagnosed with pertussis (whooping cough). I am writing to provide advice and to ask that you watch out for the symptoms of pertussis in your child, especially over the next 3 weeks.

What is pertussis?

Pertussis is an infection of the respiratory tract that can cause bouts of coughing, sometimes breathing difficulties and vomiting. It can be a very serious infection in small children. The illness can last for many weeks. It usually starts with a snuffle or a cold.

What should people who are sick with pertussis do?

If your child or a family member develops symptoms, contact your family doctor as soon as possible and take this letter with you.

This is extremely important if there is a baby less than 12 months of age living in your household.

Your doctor can advise whether pertussis is likely and arrange for early treatment if needed. Treating people who have pertussis with antibiotics can stop the infection spreading, but is more effective if started early.

To help prevent this infection spreading, people who have been diagnosed with pertussis should not attend child care, school or work until they have completed the first 5 days of a course of the recommended antibiotics. If antibiotics cannot be taken, then they must stay away for 3 weeks after onset of the cough.

How is it prevented?

Vaccination is the most important way of reducing pertussis in our community. It is important to double check that your child is fully up to date with his or her immunisations against pertussis. If in doubt, please ask your doctor to check.

NSW Health recommends adult booster vaccine every 10 years to protect from Diphtheria, Tetanus and Whooping Cough.
