Keep an eye out on Facebook to see how the week unfolds. Let the celebrations begin next week!


















Mathematics





Next week, Year 7 students at Kanahooka High will be assisting with the NAPLAN School Readiness testing. The purpose of this testing is to confirm our school's readiness through the school readiness testing (SRT). SRT is an opportunity to test school technical infrastructure, test administration processes, procedures and logistics, connectivity, number of devices and bandwidth issues.

This test will involve Year 7 doing two different tests - a writing and a numeracy task. These will happen on Monday 3 September and Wednesday 5 September, during a Mathematics and an English lesson.

It is important to remember that these tests do not have anything to do with the student's NAPLAN results, but is simply testing the school's technical infrastructure.




There were some very memorable moments caught on cameras during this activity. Students then had to "think on their feet" and break through communication barriers to successfully untangle themselves from each other.




