

MATHEMATICS

Terrific Trigonometry

10K had a chance to put their theory into practice recently. They worked in teams and had to measure the heights of students, use a trundle wheel and a clinometer. A **clinometer** is a tool that is used to measure the angle of elevation, or angle from the ground, in a right-angled triangle. You can use a **clinometer** to measure the height of tall things that you can't possibly reach to the top of, flag poles, buildings, trees. They investigated the height of the 500 Block, the goal posts on the Eastern Oval and the tallest tree in the Quad. They were engaged and had a lot of fun learning and solving the problems. Their results were impressive too!

Mr Howard's 7T Food Technology class has been busy this week. Last week, the class cooked up a fried rice feast in the kitchen. Each group demonstrated a mature approach to their cooking and worked well in groups to produce their dish. Mr Howard has kindly offered to share the recipe for any budding Master Chefs out there. Here is the recipe:

Fried rice Ingredients

½ Rasher of bacon 1/4 Onion 1/8 Red capsicum 1T Frozen peas 1 Egg

1C Pre-cooked rice 1T Soy sauce

1T Oil 1 Shallot

Equipment Asian style bowl Chopsticks Frypan















Method

Make 2 shallot curls and place in cold water. Chop bacon. Dice onion and capsicum. Beat egg in a small bowl. Heat ½ the oil in a frypan, cook omelette, cut into strips. Add remaining oil to frypan, sauté bacon, onion and capsicum. Add rice, egg and peas. Add soy sauce. Mix thoroughly. Serve and garnish with shallot curls.
















DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Always Was, Always Will Be.


8-15 NOV 2020

Students and staff are currently adding the finishing touches to this year's preparations.







SCHOOL TRAVEL

School Travel for 2021



2021 SCHOOL TRAVEL APPLICATIONS ARE NOW OPEN

Students who require a School Opal card for 2021 can now apply online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should reapply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails

Applications need to be submitted before **31 December 2020** to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

From January onwards, there will be a number of School Opal cards expiring, as the physical card has reached its lifespan. These are cards for students who will be in Years 8 to 12 in 2021, and only those Opal cards, which haven't been replaced in the last five years.

Impacted students and/or their parent/carer will be contacted directly by Transport for NSW via email or post. They will be asked to confirm their details online in order for a new School Opal to be sent to the correct postal address in time for the new school year.

If contacted by Transport for NSW, details should be submitted online by 1 December 2020 at the latest. Affected students who do not confirm their details in time will have a new School Opal card posted to the address we currently have on file.




