


Year 7 have been creative, working on designs for their monsters in Mandatory Technology – Textiles. Students will make the monster dolls out of felt as the term moves on.


To get started, students are learning some basic hand stitching and how to sew a button on. They will also learn other embellishments to decorate their monsters.



Firstly, I would like to thank the staff, students and community for the warm reception I have received since my arrival. I also want to reinforce how proud I have been of our community at Kanahooka High School and to extend my thanks to all our students and parents for their support as we navigated the learning from home period.

As Year 11 come to the end of their first term of studying for the Higher School Certificate, it is important that students continue to develop effective study and revision habits to enable them to be as successful as possible.

To support students to achieve, KHS is currently in the process of rejuvenating Senior Study Hub for those students who have dropped subjects and now have study periods.





This involves having a dedicated teacher to help our students with aspects of their schooling such as assessment tasks, homework, essay writing and study routines.

Students will also be able to access other services within this space such as Careers and online learning modules to support their future pathways. Currently students with study periods are expected to be in Room 810. After the last HSC examination, this will change to the Library.



Students in HSC courses also have access to an online resource call Edrolo. Edrolo is a curriculum focused resource with video lessons, exam practice, and more.

Whilst this is not available for every subject, it is an extremely valuable resource for students at our school. Edrolo is a great way for students to revise content, practise responses and prepare for examinations. Students should speak to their teachers if they have not yet accessed this resource.


CLONTARF
