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Hello Term 4



The students were polite, courteous and a pleasure to be with for the day.







Our new HSC Numeracy students engaged in an investigative household budgeting task this term.


Students researched their careers of interest and quarterly expenses in the Illawarra region.


This task was specifically designed, given the current financial climate, to prepare these young adults for the possible challenges ahead.


In preparation for their first HSC assessment, students have participated in deep discussions about working and managing their future finances meaningfully.


It has been a great start to their first days of Year 12 and HSC Numeracy students are to be commended for their efforts.
















UNDERSTAND GRAFFITI LAWS



Tough graffiti laws in New South Wales give police special powers to search, arrest, fine or charge individuals. Penalties range from community services and/or compensation and can include:

- · Marking property without owner's consent. Max penalty: \$2,200 fine or imprisonment for 12 months.
- · Possession of a graffiti implement with intent. Max penalty: \$1,100 fine or imprisonment for 6 months.

This term, our school is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student, staff and parent/carer surveys. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students, staff, parents/carers think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Thank you for your patience with Immunisations.

Due to the public holiday at the end of last term Year 7 and catch-up Immunisations with NSW Health have now been scheduled for Tuesday 15 November 2022.

The schedule is as follows:



Year	Vaccine	Number of Doses	Completion Status
Year 7	Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine	2 doses at least 6 months apart	Dose one - Completed Dose two scheduled for 15 November
	Diphtheria-Tetanus-Pertussis (Whooping Cough) vaccine	Single dose	Completed
Years 10	Meningococcal ACWY vaccine	Single dose	Completed

Please note that to improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses during Year 7 or 8 (for HPV and dTpa vaccination) and during Year 10 or 11 (for Menignococcal ACWY vaccination) if consent was signed in 2021 or 2022.

Parents and carers who wish to withdraw their consent for Immunisations for any reason may do so by writing to the school or phoning the school.

The Procedure for Withdrawal of Consent is available on the NSW Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/ Pages/withdraw consent.aspx.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at each clinic either as a physical card or a text message sent to the mobile number recorded on the consent form. Details about vaccinations given at school will also be uploaded to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR) to support complete vaccination histories.

It has been a fantastic year for learning so far in Science and while we draw closer to the end, there is still quite a bit before we are there.

Year 7 are currently finishing their learning in the Forces unit of work. This topic introduces students to basic Physics concepts before they study these again in more depth across Years 8, 9 and 10. They will soon move into our Space unit of work after completing their Semester Two Examination which will be held in class throughout Week 4.

Year 8 have just started their Chemical Science unit of work which deepens their understanding of key concepts in Chemistry. The Semester Two Examination for Year 8 is scheduled for Week 4 and will be completed before students begin studying Resources as their final unit of work for Year 8 and Stage 4.

Year 9 have been delving deep into the world of Waves, studying the behaviour of light and sound and how these are transmitted. Year 9 will also be completing their Semester Two Examination in Week 4 before moving into Healthy Bodies as their final unit of work for 2022.

Year 10 are nearing the end of their Chemical World unit of work where students apply their understanding of Chemistry to a variety of new situations and explore other factors which can influence the way chemical reactions occur. Year 10 will complete their Semester Two Examination in Week 3 before finishing the Stage 5 Science course with the Universe unit of work.

On behalf of the Science faculty, I would also like to wish the best of luck to our outgoing Year 12 students as they complete the HSC examinations. We wish you every success for the future.

I would also like to welcome our new Year 12 Science cohort as they begin their HSC studies. I look forward to watching you continue to tackle every challenge in your learning across our Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Investigating Science and Marine Studies courses.

And finally, I would like to share some photos capturing the learning of students in Science and the STEM elective over the past few weeks.


Check out the self-propelled robots that STEM students have been programming to follow pathways, using different colours on the track to help the robots make decisions about their next movements.


There are also some snaps of Year 10 as they have tested how different factors such as surface area and concentration affect the rate of a chemical reaction.




















Year 9 Marine and Aquaculture Technology





















