It's Race Day!

After months of hard work, race day finally arrived for our very talented Year 9 STEM students. Throughout Term 3, the students designed and built balsa wood CO_2 racing cars, which are then powered by CO_2 gas cartridges. The students used a range of different online tools to design and test their cars virtually, such as Computer Aided Modelling (CAM) and Computational Fluid Dynamics (CFD), before settling on a final design. Students were given a balsa wood block to carve and shape their cars out of, before putting the finishing touches on them by conditional results.

Whilst this exercise is designed to be fun and an engaging learning activity, there are state, national and world championships for CO₂ racing cars. The F1 in Schools program allows students from all over the world to flex their engineering and creative muscle, with the hope that in the future some of these students will obtain jobs in engineering and aerodynamics. Although our students are not at that level just yet, it was great to see some of the innovative solutions devised by our very talented Year 9 students.








FINANCIAL LIFE SKILLS UPDATE - 3

Are minimum repayments good?

When you only pay the minimum, you are paying so little toward the principal balance every month, you're actually increasing the amount of time you're in debt. This increases the time you'll keep making interest payments, which causes the total amount you're paying to grow. This is not a good idea, although at times in your life it may be absolutely necessary. If necessary, it is important that the consumer only does it for a very short time.






